PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Today I would like to share a story with you - one about letting go, doing the right thing, and giving a gift of love. It concerns our placing one of our adult dogs in another household - something we thought we could never bring ourselves to do.

She is a four year old black girl. We acquired her at ten months old - a shy but pretty girl. She lacked confidence and was very submissive. We worked very hard to bring her out of her shell. At her first Specialty she took second place in the 12-18 month class out of 22 dogs. That shocked us and the breeder who gave her to us. She eventually garnered four points and one Best of Breed.

Alas she was always a needy dog, seeking attention all the time and she hated to sleep outside. She disliked the latter so much, on the last walk of the night she would hide in the bushes to try and forestall being put in the kennel for the night. We had also made a decision not to breed her due to some health concerns, so we would probably not continue to show her either.

My wife and I had discussed placing a dog and how difficult it would be. We knew others who had done it and marveled at their ability to let go. But when we acquired a new yellow boy, bringing our pack to 8, things were getting crowded [Did I mention we live in the city?] So when we got an email from a couple seeking an older dog we started to give it some thought.

They were a nice couple who had recently lost both their older labs and whose children were now off to college. We offered to meet with them, and chose our Specialty as the place. They arrived at the specialty early enough to meet with us and our girl and then see her show (Open Black) where she came in second of nine. They were smitten with her, we liked them, and we decided to let her live with them on a trial basis. The day they came to pick her up, she rode away in the passenger seat of a sports car, acting for all the world like she had ridden there all her life.

Of course they love her and she has a wonderful life as the "only" dog in their house as opposed to being one of eight in ours. Yet it was one of the hardest things we've ever done voluntarily, and to this day we miss her terribly. But we knew in our hearts it was the right thing for her, and it was truly a gift that carried the love we gave her on to her new home.

Litter listing requirements:

Members may submit litter listings for their dogs or bitches. As stated in the GGLRC Breeders Code of Ethics, before a litter will be listed in Retriever Reflections, you must submit health clearance information for both the dog and the bitch: OFA or Wind-Morgan clearances and certification by a board-certified veterinary ophthalmologist that the dog has been examined and found free of hereditary eye disease within the last year. You must indicate whether or not the parents have met the Code of

Ethics performance requirement (CD, one championship point, JAM, field title, WC, or GGLRC Retrieving Dog Elementary certificate).

We require a \$10 donation to Golden Gate Labrador Rescue for a litter listing. Each listing may appear twice. Please submit listings in writing to Editor, Melinda Grosch. Make checks payable to GGLRC and send to:

Puppy Dog 6-9 months

1. <u>Caerleons Mad Hatter</u> - Upstanding Yellow with kind eye and expression.Correct front angulation. In very good coat. Best of

feet. Lovely turn of stifle and moved well. Promising

- 2. <u>Winterwind Arrows Flight</u> Very much a baby. Loved his sweet expression. Good length of muzzle and good reach of neck. Correct coat. Moved well for one so young.
- 3. <u>Decoys Number 17</u> Lovely eye shape. Just needs to develop in head. Very well constructed all through. Very good tailset straight off back. Needs to tighten in movement.
- 4. <u>Bouldinaire's Great Gatsby</u> Just a little slack in eyelid at the moment, but should come as head breaks. Good pigmentation. Very good front and moved quite well.

Puppy Dog 9-12 months

- 1. <u>Belgairn Troubleson</u> Lovely headed dog with melting expression and kind eye. Correct construction. Short coupled and well muscled. Good turn of stifle. Moved well.
- 2. <u>Laurglens Rockin The Boat at Rivermark</u> Nice head and expression. Good reach of neck. Good feet. Level topline and good tailset. Moved well.
- 3. <u>Dalwater Martini At Rycroft</u> Short coupled and full of breed type.Still very babyish and needs to tighten in movement. Very strong backend.
- 4. <u>Bazurtos I Am Too Hot To Handle</u> Liked his eye shape ,colour head and expression. Good reach of neck. Strong stifles and second thigh. A little long cast at this stage of his development.

12-18 month dogs

- 1. <u>Marstad Prime Time</u> Loved his gorgeous head and expression. Correct front with tight feet. In good coat and condition, carrying the correct amount of weight. Level topline leading to correct tailset. Moved with purpose and drive.
- 2. <u>Mulbury Stowaway Evan</u> Lovely moulded head with sweet expression. Correct front angulation. Good reach of neck. Level topline held on the move. Very good turn of stifle. Well handled. Close up to 1st.
- 3. <u>Alibis Talkin Smack</u> Lovely yellow of quality. One of many who suffered in the heat today. Excellent body properties. Well muscled up. In very good coat.
- 4. <u>Epoch's One For The Road</u> I would have preferred a slightly darker eye colour but nice shape and expression. Barrel ribs. Short coupled. Good second thigh. Positive on the move and well handled.

Amateur Owner Handler

1. <u>Salona Hills Bet The Farm</u> - Good length of muzzle. Bite was very tight but correct. Carrying too much weight which detracts from his movement. Very attentive to handler and well presented.

Bred By Exhibitor

1. Wyntercreek Party Of One - Good headed dog with melting expression. Lovely eye shape and colour. Good front angulation. Coat of correct texture. Good turn of stifle. Short hocks. Moved very well with drive.

2. <u>Salona Hills Brownstone</u> - Another typey dog of quality close up to 1st. Good length of muzzle. Very good feet. Good head and expression. Plenty of bone and substance. Carries coat of correct texture and moved very well.

American Bred Dogs

- 1. <u>Skyline Bold Temptation</u> Lovely headed black with good length of muzzle ,kind eye and soft expression. Correct front angulation. Great spring of rib. Well coated. Good turn of stifle. Went well.
- 2. <u>Lindsey's Seashell Puppy</u> Pleasing yellow with very good pigmentation. Correct front. Good feet. Not in the best coat and suffered with the heat.
- 3 Marstad Moonshine Young dog with excellent head. Rather short in upper arm. Good coat just on the blow. Strong backend. Moved ok when settled.

Open Black

- 1. <u>Mulbury's Logan</u> Clean Headed dog with gorgeous head and expression. Excellent front with good reach of neck. Tight feet. Put down in great condition and very well handled. Very good otter type tail straight off back. In hard muscular condition. Covered the ground on the move. Lovely dog. Later understood that this win gave him his title. Well deserved.
- 2. <u>Harlequin Incognito</u> A very smart dog who has a very pleasing head. Good front with barrel ribs and good coat. Level topline. Tail was a little short. Moved very well.
- 3. Sommersett Free N Easy Very close up to 2nd and same comments apply in that he was a lovely headed dog with correct front angulation and strong through ribcage. Good turn of stifle and well let down hocks.
- 4. <u>Picklecreek Joyride</u> Carrying far too much weight which was a shame as he has many attributes. Liked his head and expression.

Open Chocolate

1. <u>Salona Hills Now And Then</u> - Strong dog with good head and length of muzzle. Correct eye shape and colour. Correct front. Very strong body properties. Moved with style.

Open Yellow

- 1. <u>Belgairn Hart Ranch Naruto</u> Sweetest of heads, not overdone in any way. Good front construction and plenty of bone. Plenty of heartroom. Coat of good texture. Good tailset and excellent second thigh. Moved very well.
- 2. <u>Blackthorns Yellow Jacket O'Spiritwood</u> Lovely head and expression. Very close up. Great pigmentation. Melting expression. Lovely front and reach of neck. Very good turn of stifle. Moved very well and handled to perfection.
- 3. <u>Keltons Finest Hour</u> I would have preferred more length of muzzle. Correct front assembly and excellent tight feet. Not carrying any excess weight. Moved very well.
- 4. Decoys Chasing A Dream At Sunset Particularly liked his sweet expression. In good coat and condition. Well muscled and moved well.

Puppy Bitch 6-9 months

- 1. Arlons Noxzema Jackson What a sweet little girl! Full of breed type. Gorgeous head and expression. Very well constructed throughout. In excellent coat and condition. Excelled on the move for one so young. Best Puppy
- 2. <u>Skyline Catch This One</u> Lovely chocolate bitch of quality. Correct eye shape and colour. Good length of muzzle. Well made throughout. Another who shows great promise.
- 3. <u>Chablais Peaches And Cream</u> Pretty bitch in excellent condition. Very good pigmentation. Tight feet. Good harsh coat and moved well.
- 4. <u>Caerleons Through The Looking Glass</u> Pretty head and good reach of neck. Slightly short in upper arm. Very good turn of stifle and moved well.

Puppy 9-12 months

- 1. <u>Belgairn Leading Edge</u> Just loved her head and expression. Correct front with plenty of heartroom. Good tight feet. Level topline held on the move. Good turn of stifle. Covered the ground with ease.
- 2. <u>Lawson's The Other Reindeer At Arlon</u> Pretty head and expression. Very good front construction. Rather slack in pastern but this will come with roadwork. Not quite confident enough on the day.

Labrador bitches 12-18 months

- 1. <u>Blackthorn Spirit of Texas</u> This bitch has that quality and panache that demands your attention. Lovely head and expression. Lovely front ,leading to tight feet. Lovely ribcage and in super coat and condition. Excellent second thigh and moved with drive -4 point winners bitch.
- 2. <u>Marstad Personal</u> Another who I feel is out of the top drawer. Lovely head and expression. Well made all through. Lovely tailset with thick otter tail. Drove well off short hocks-Very promising.
- 3. <u>Broyhill Stella Artois</u> Good expression. Good length of muzzle. Correct harsh coat. Slightly longer cast than the first two. Another good mover.
- 4. <u>Drycreek Shes A Hottie</u> Pretty bitch with plenty of substance. Good confirmation and moved well.

Amateur Owner Handler

1. <u>Cinderhill Waterproof Lydia</u> - Good eye colour and shape. Correct length of muzzle. I would have preferred slightly more bone. Good topline and well muscled. Tail a little feathery. Moved well.

Bred by Exhibitor

- 1. <u>Broyhill Gemstone</u> Typey bitch of quality. Lovely head with melting expression. Used her ears to advantage. In lovely coat and condition. Very good second thigh and good turn of stifle. Moved very well.
- 2. <u>Blackthorns Augusta O Tealwood</u> Close up to 1st and shares the same attributes. Coat just on the blow,but a quality exhibit. Another lovely mover.

3. <u>Trilliums Kind Of Cheesy</u> - Lovely eye shape and colour. Good front. I would have preferred more reach of neck. In excellent coat. Could have carried less weight to advantage. However she moved well.

American Bred Bitches

- 1. <u>Picklecreek Bread And Butter</u> Another with lovely head and expression. Very good front and reach of neck. Good coat of correct texture. Level topline held on the move. Good tailset. Lovely turn of stifle. Moved very well.
- 2. <u>Nipntuck Charismatic</u> Close up to the winner and same positive comments apply. Not quite in her best coat on the day. Drove well off short hocks. A quality exhibit.
- 3. <u>Janlons Hot Buttered Rum</u> Lovely headed yellow with good pigment. Correct length of muzzle. In good coat and condition. Used her tail to advantage. Another good mover.
- 4. <u>Spirithawk Let It Ride</u> Lovely head but rather short in upper arm causing her to pin in front coming towards the judge. Not in her best jacket. Extremely well handled

Open Black Bitches

- 1. <u>Delby Marstad Camilla</u> Full of breed type having that lovely melting expression. Good length of muzzle. Lovely front. Plenty of heartroom. Barrel ribbed and short coupled. Very good turn of stifle and muscular second thigh. Moved well.
- 2. Whistle Stop Ladies Choice Lovely eye colour. Just a shade fuller in eye than winner. Very good front and reach of neck. Excellent coat and great otter type tail. Well muscled up. Moved with drive. Very well handled.
- 3. <u>Mulburys Devine Design</u> Full of breed type. Very pretty bitch. Carries a lovely coat. Has excellent tight feet. Tailset good. Good second thigh. Sound mover.
- 4. <u>Hearts Even A Snowy Night</u> Stronger headed bitch. I would have preferred a longer length of muzzle. Good front. Deep bodied and excellent strong quarters. Well handled.

Open Chocolate

- 1. <u>Blu Top Ma Chere Ami</u> Very good length of muzzle. Correct eye shape and colour. Deep chested with plenty of heartroom. Coat of correct texture. Level topline and good tail. Covered the ground with ease.
- 2. <u>Gingerbread Xanadu</u> Pretty bitch with all the essentials. Short coupled. Very good turn of stifle and short hocks. Another very good mover.
- 3. <u>Epoch's Luck Be A Lady At Arlon</u> Rather light in eye and a little shy on the day. Good front and very tight feet. I would have preferred more turn of stifle. Moved quite well.

Open Yellow

- 1. <u>Mainlands Mulligan Bridget At Chibri</u> A very pretty headed bitch with good eye shape and colour. Good reach of neck and carrying the correct coat. Good tailset. Well muscled second thigh. Moved well.
- 2. Dryck's Cowgirl Up For Lindsey Close up. Another with
